#### **Arabia CSR Awards**

The Arabia CSR Awards were created in 2008 to fill a void and replenish the much needed thirst for a CSR centric sustainability best practice. By implementing international frameworks and principles like the UN Global Compact Ten Principles, the GRI standards, the EFQM business excellence model and the 17UN SDGs. The Awards have succeeded in earning the respect and acknowledgement of big brands, multinational and regional powerhouses that continue to vie for the top spot. The 15th cycle of the Arabia CSR Awards was conducted under the prestigious Patronage of H.E. Eng. Sheikh Salem Bin Sultan Bin Saqr Al Qasimi, Chairman of the Department of Civil Aviation RAK and Member of the Government of Ras Al Khaimah's Executive Council. The number of registrations received in 2022, stood at 111 which were spread over 15 categories.

31 CSR and sustainability champions were announced and facilitated in a grand ceremony held on 5th October, at Hyatt Regency Dubai Creek Heights. The applicants gave strong evidences that organisations in the Arab World have not only embraced best international CSR and sustainability best practices, but are also leading across the globe in creating and developing robust policies and strategies for ESG issues and opportunities. #### The 4th Annual (GISD) Alliance Meeting

The Fourth Annual Global Investors for Sustainable Development (GISD) Alliance meeting took place at the UN headquarters in New York on **12<sup>th</sup> October**. Members of the GISD Alliance met the Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and other top executives in a close session. Ms. Habiba Al Mar'ashi as a member of the Alliance attended physically the same.

Experts delivered bold solutions to unlock long term transformative investment solutions for bridging the financing gap for developing countries to reach the ambitious 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) - the agreed roadmap for a more peaceful and inclusive world.





The discussion between GISD Alliance CEOs and Member States focused on:

- Scaling up finance to achieve the SDGs through joint actions by the public and private sectors at all levels
- Strengthening the alignment of private finance and investment with sustainable development and climate action requirements ahead of the G20 Summit and COP27
- Developing instruments, tools and platforms to channel SDG-aligned investments to developing countries.

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Panel Discussion

Arabia CSR Network joined its sister organisation, the Emirates Environmental Group to conduct the 5<sup>th</sup> Panel Discussion on **20<sup>th</sup> October** in a hybrid format under the theme **"Achieving Net Zero: Spotlighting Urban Sprawls"**. The session was by supported by EGBC, CEBC and the Swiss Business Council. KEO was the Co-sponsor and Smart Automation Energy was the support sponsor of this event that was conducted at Holiday Inn Dubai – Al Barsha.

In the opening speech and address to the audience, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi, Founder, President & CEO of ACSRN said that "Research shows that more than 50% of the world's population currently lives in cities, and that figure is expected to increase to almost 70% by 2050. Cities generate around 70% of global carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions. As societies recover from the Covid-19 pandemic, CO<sub>2</sub> rates are unfortunately rebounding rapidly."

This panel addressed several of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals including SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities, SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Productions, SDG 13: Climate Change, SDG 15: Life on land & SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals.

#### 6th Phase of the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park

ACSRN's Corporate Member, Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA), has invited international developers to send their Expressions of Interest (EOI) to implement the 6th phase of the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park based on the Independent Power Producer (IPP) model. H.E. Saeed Mohammed Al Tayer, MD & CEO of DEWA said that "The 900 MW 6<sup>th</sup> phase of the Solar Park will be implemented using photovoltaic solar panels. It will become operational in stages starting from Q3 of 2025. We work in line with the vision and directives of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, to achieve the Dubai Clean Energy Strategy 2050 and the Net Zero Carbon Emissions Strategy 2050 to provide 100% of the total power production capacity from clean energy sources by 2050."

The production capacity of clean energy has reached about 12.1% of Dubai's total energy mix and is expected to reach 14% by the end of this year. The Solar Park, implemented by DEWA using the IPP model, is the largest single-site solar park in the world, with total investments of AED 50 billion. When completed, the Solar Park will reduce more than 6.5 million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions annually.

# Global Potential to Increase Generation from Hydropower Projects

Hydropower is currently the world's largest source of low-carbon generation and it will continue to play an important role as the world pursues net zero power systems. However, new hydropower dams can impose considerable tradeoffs, such as impacts to free-flowing rivers and the people and ecosystems that depend on them. But hydropower generation and/or energy storage services can be expanded significantly with little or no tradeoffs. Between retrofits of existing hydropower dams, adding turbines to non-powered dams, floating solar on hydropower reservoirs, and off-channel pumped storage, the world can add considerable amounts of generation and storage from hydropower projects without building any new dams.



Central to stabilising the planet's climate is a rapid decarbonisation of the economy, including power systems, requiring a dramatic expansion of renewable generation capacity. Hydropower is currently the global leader among renewable generation technologies (although wind and solar PV are by far the dominant sources of new generation added each year). Several forecasts of how the world can achieve a net zero power system by 2050 include a doubling of global hydropower capacity, such as analyses from the International Energy Agency (IEA) and the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA).
