Finally, January 2023 will see the unveiling of the 16th cycle of Arabia CSR Awards, which will reach a new milestone, having successfully completed one and a half decade.

ACSRN President addressed the 'Urban Thinkers Campus' at the UN Habitat

Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi, President & CEO, ACSRN and GUD Vice-Chair and UAE Coordinator joined as a panel speaker on 11th November a United Nations Habitat – Urban Thinkers Campus. The session was conducted in a hybrid way under the theme "New Technologies, Materials, and Methods for Affordable and Sustainable Construction and Development".

The session was conducted on 29th November 2022 in hybrid format.

Accenture Middle East Innovation Maturity Index

Accenture – a corporate member of ACSRN carried out a survey of the C-level executives from 200 large companies in the UAE and Saudi Arabia between August and October 2020 to understand the extent of the region's current innovation maturity. The report which has been published this year, found that 67% of Middle East executives indicate that they have taken measures to modernise their existing technology infrastructure – moving from data servers to cloud storage – in the past five years. This figure is poised to increase to 86% in the next five years.

Accenture also highlighted that "However, only a handful of regional companies have put in place structural actions which could help them become agile and flexible in their workforce. Companies need to intensify their innovation and make greater strides in their business transformation."

Accenture Research's global work on best practices for governing innovation was applied using the Innovation Maturity Index methodology. They also evaluated the same set of companies for their current adoption of 12 innovation habits and the expected adoption in the next five years to determine the extent of their innovation impact.


Positive Steps on Food and Agriculture Amid COP 27 Compromises

The raised profile for food and farming at COP 27 better reflects the contribution the agri-food sector could make to global emission reductions.

The COP 27 climate conference in Sharm el-Sheikh closed on Sunday (20 November) in much the same manner as COP 26 did in Glasgow a year ago, with a mixture of relief among delegations that they had something to show for their two weeks at the luxury Egyptian resort, and widespread dissatisfaction among external stakeholders with what the conference had achieved

Those striving for a more sustainable, climate-friendly food system, however, may see COP 27 in a more favourable light than other





The FAO announced during COP 27 it intends to publish, by next year's conference, a climate plan for the agri-food sector to show how food and farming can align with the UN goal of limiting global warming to 1.5°C. FAO deputy director Zitouni Ould-Dada made the commitment at an event hosted by FAIRR, an organisation advising investors on material ESG issues in the animal protein sector.

As the conference drew to a close, a group of the world's largest agricultural commodity corporations, facilitated by the World Economic Forum (WEF) and the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD), launched the Agriculture Sector Roadmap to 1.5°C.
