### Decreasing Wildlife Population, Increasing Human Population: Balancing the Natural Biodiversity

ACSRN joined its Environmental Partner, the Emirates Environmental Group in conducting the **3rd Panel Discussion** of the year on **23rd August** in support of the UAE's "Year of Sustainability." The content-rich hybrid discourse was held under the theme **"Decreasing Wildlife Population, Increasing Human Population: Balancing the Natural Biodiversity."** The session's central focus was the indispensability to promptly mobilise actions that reinstall equilibrium and harmonious coexistence between the realms of wildlife and Homo sapiens.

In her inaugural address, the President & CEO of ACSRN eloquently highlighted the gravity of preserving our intricate biodiversity. She concurrently extolled the enduring contributions of EEG, spanning decades, in cultivating environmental awareness and advocacy across various strata of society's stakeholders.

The discussion brought 5 distinguished and experientially-diverse panellists namely:

Through meticulously crafted presentations, the panellists elucidated the factors behind dwindling wildlife populations, both conventional and emerging strategies in biodiversity conservation, the intricate interplay between anthropogenic pursuits and wildlife metrics, as well as the often underestimated repercussions of biodiversity erosion on human survival. Valid inquiries were raised, questioning the potential for wildlife adaptation to rapidly transforming climate when human beings themselves have yet to acclimatise adequately. The expert data-driven perspectives of the speakers combined with the intriguing questions of the audience crystalised the narrative of safeguarding wildlife habitats and preserving their sustainable population sizes.




#### **Tristar Sustainability Report 2022**

This pioneering move underscores McDonald's UAE's steadfast dedication to advancing gender equality, an endeavour that has been at the forefront since the inauguration of the Women Leadership Network (WLN) in 2020. The WLN, designed to nurture and empower female team members, remains a cornerstone of the company's commitment to inclusivity and progress.



Beyond its strides in gender diversity, the new restaurant symbolises McDonald's UAE's unwavering commitment to environmental sustainability and innovation. Outfitted with solar panels that partially power the establishment and equipped with electric vehicle charging ports, the restaurant exemplifies the company's ongoing mission to curtail its carbon footprint while promoting renewable energy sources.

It is also worthwhile to state that McDonald's UAE has been actively operating the Biodiesel programme since 2011, wherein used cooking oil is ingeniously converted into biodiesel to fuel the company's trucks. This dual-purpose approach minimises waste and diminishes reliance on non-renewable fossil fuels.

The inauguration of this restaurant signifies a momentous achievement in McDonald's UAE's journey toward championing gender diversity, advancing sustainability, circular economy and low carbon economy as well as enriching customer convenience within the quick-service restaurant industry.

# Why startups must factor in ESG for investment success

In years gone by, it was idealistic millennials who spurred growth in sustainable investments. But today, every single generation is considering environmental, social and governance (ESG) options or how their funds can help to build a positive impact economy. ESG is often talked about as strategically vital for larger corporations, but little is said of how startup success and growth can be directly linked to a solid ESG strategy.

An optimal ESG framework takes various factors into account including reducing carbon footprint, encouraging diversity, going green and introducing wellness programmes for employees. It also focuses on initiatives that matter the most to a business and are the easiest to mobilise. A solid ESG strategy also earns customer loyalty, reduces operating costs and improves both asset management and financial performance.

Investors and lenders are highly attracted to organisations that invest in ESG – in fact, a 2022 Dow Jones survey of 200 investment professionals projected that ESG investments would more than double over the next three years. By providing a comprehensive view of their ESG practices and goals, entrepreneurs can influence decisions and encourage investors to pick their companies for funding.

If you are a smaller player do not assume that a lack of resources will be a hindrance to adopting ESG, or that your ESG efforts won't pay off in the long run. They will always have a positive effect on a business. Smaller businesses are frequently in closer proximity to their customers and have more opportunities to share their sustainability stories and connect at a deeper level.

Founders who make efforts to promote diversity, give back to the community, improve labour relations and take a stand on socioeconomic issues will play a major role in strengthening a company's brand. And startups can attract socially conscious investors with less bureaucracy than larger organisations.

ESG not only makes a company favourable to investors, but it can also lead to an uptick in its financials. Even small efforts towards sustainability, such as recycling, going paperless and making energy-efficient upgrades can improve a company's bottom line and ROI. And naturally, this makes it even more attractive as an investment.







# Best Practices 2021 From The Archives SALAM Social Enterprise 1st Runner Up - Social Enterprise Category

#### **Profile**

Salam Social Enterprise is a platform that focuses on community development and women's empowerment by producing local face masks and other community products in order to cover shortages in Sudan. It envisions a society where Sudanese women are strong and financially independent and therefore works towards empowering them to achieve these ends.

Some of the values the organisation has imbibed for its work with the community include: honesty, integrity, professionalism, respect, gender sensitivity and equity, teamwork, social accountability and community participation. It was set up in 2018 in Sudan and supports underprivileged population to gain access to better life and employment opportunities by addressing developmental and skill gaps. Salam has been able to move towards and achieve its goals through effective collaborations.



SALAM Social Enterprise has undoubtedly made good strides in the field of community development and supporting women's empowerment. Its project for the manufacturing and provision of low-cost sanitary pads for underprivileged women is a one-of-a-kind initiative in the region. Its overall vision and commitment to the cause are very evident from its solid work on the ground and effective partnerships. SALAM Social Enterprise has used community initiatives to generate much-needed interventions in areas where employable skills and employment were lacking.

The organisation has been able to make inroads in places which were unreached and has put a special focus on underprivileged women. Through its initiatives of skills training amongst these women, as well as providing employment and income generation opportunities, it has provided a ray of hope for women in the remote communities of Sudan. Its two-fold approach of training women in the required employment skills, while also creating products to cater to present requirements — like face masks during the COVID-19 pandemic, and sanitary pads to cater to essential feminine hygiene requirements — have shown its foresight and commitment to address and support local and regional community issues.

Environmental concerns have also been well integrated into its initiatives as its products are sustainable and environment friendly and there is a clear adherence to energy conservation. The organisation's work has shown that good partnerships can help scale up operations and prove to be beneficial for the community, as demonstrated by its association with Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit for the production of facemasks for COVID-19 prevention, and collaboration with Norwegian Refugee Council as well as Relief International for the provision of dignity kits.
