Due to the popular demand, EEG opened a site in Ajman as well in this cycle bringing the total to 6 designated locations; 3 in Dubai namely Zabeel Park, Al Barsha Pond Park, Al Mamzar Park, in Ras Al Khaimah at RAK Ceramics Factory, in Abu Dhabi at American International School and in Ajman at Ajman Museum!

The collective contributions of private organisations, academic institutions, government entities and families resulted in the collection of **7,002 kg** of Aluminium Cans for recycling. Since its inception, EEG has managed to collect **415,028 kg** of Aluminium Cans for recycling, which has resulted in the mitigation of **6,230 MTCO**₂e, saving of **10,075 m**³ of landfill space and the conservation of **94,454 million BTU of energy**.

A successful development agenda requires inclusive partnerships — built upon principles and values, a shared vision and goals that place people and the planet at the centre. With this thought in mind, EEG was delighted bring on board several partners and supporters for this campaign in addition to ACSRN namely, Dubai Municipality, American International School (AUH), RAK Ceramics Factory and Ajman Museum for providing the venue support; Department of Economy & Tourism in Dubai for mobilising and encouraging the hospitality sector to come on board and actively participate. The webinar started with a reveal and discussion of a guidance publication of UNEP and One Planet Network titled Communicating Chemical in Products – which details the importance of disclosing harmful chemicals by manufactures and to consumers, role of chemicals in sustainable consumption and production, fundamental principles to follow, aspirations, best practices and more.

A panel discussion followed consisting of three speakers representing environmental justice, fashion industry and private chemical manufacturers, they brought their perspectives to the table to address chemicals and sustainability.

Some of the key discussion points included transparency to consumers, impact of chemicals in the entire life cycle of and not only the end product, and also the value added in investing in sustainable chemicals, global laws, ecolabels and more.

Through its subsidiaries, Crown Holdings, Inc. is a major global provider of rigid, transit and protective packaging materials, equipment, and services to a wide range of end markets. Crown's 18 manufacturing facilities of beverage cans expand over 13 countries out of which 5 are operated in the MENA region.

Crown has adopted a comprehensive action plan with the title 'Twentyby30' with an intention to bring about reforms in the following areas over the passage of 10 years- regulatory and supply chain processes, employee safety, diversity and inclusion, workforce skill up gradation etc.

- Successful collaboration with various global initiatives like the Science-Based Targets initiative (SBTi), Business Ambition Pledge for 1.5°C, The Climate Pledge C.D.P., United Nations Global Compact, RE100 and Ellen MacArthur Foundation, has ensured numerous advantages for Crown.
- By facilitating the participation of employees in leadership-driven community initiatives that carry the power to bring positive and measurable change, Crown has been able to directly benefit the local and regional communities through these programmes.
- A work environment free from abuse, harassment, exploitation and discrimination, which is a non- malleable pillar of the institution, has been pivotal in upholding the fundamental human rights of stakeholders.

Crown operates 5 can factories across the Middle East and North Africa, strategically located in key regions. These include CROWN Arabia Can in Saudi Arabia (with facilities in Dammam and Jeddah), CROWN Middle East Can in Jordan (located in Amman), CROWN Emirates Company in the United Arab Emirates (based in Dubai), and CROWN Maghreb Can in Tunisia (situated in Tunis). Notably, the Jebel Ali plant of Crown Emirates Company in Dubai boasts impressive production figures, churning out a staggering 1,480 million cans across 6 different sizes and 1,840 million lids. In 2021 alone, this facility contributed significantly to Crown's revenue, generating an impressive \$170 million.

In line with its commitment to sustainability, Crown introduced the Twentyby30 Sustainability Programme in 2020. This comprehensive initiative comprises 20 quantifiable sustainability objectives that the company aims to achieve by the end of 2030. These objectives are carefully aligned with the top priorities of both internal and external stakeholders, addressing critical global issues. Key focus areas of the programme include material use economy, recycling initiatives, responsible and ethical sourcing practices, as well as food contact and chemical safety measures. The programme also sets science-based targets for reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and outlines ambitious water stewardship goals.

In a proactive move towards sustainability, Crown Emirates launched a waste and resource management project in 2021. The primary objective of this project is to minimize material consumption, reduce electricity and gas usage, optimize water consumption, and mitigate waste generation. Through this initiative, Crown Emirates aims to equip its operational teams with necessary training, closely examine processes in collaboration with suppliers and relevant authorities such as the Dubai municipality, and identify areas for improvement. By implementing corrective and enhancement measures, Crown is committed to advancing its sustainability efforts while simultaneously contributing positively to the environment and society at large.
